The enrollment impact of the Medicaid expansion varies; some states expanded coverage to parents and other adults at income levels above the level required under federal law before the Affordable Care Act. For purposes of this report, the term “states” includes the 50 states and the District of Columbia.

Data Context Notes:

- For March 2018, CMS is reporting growth of 16,270,664 compared to July-September 2013. This figure is less than the 16,327,895 in net enrollment growth that was included in the Medicaid and CHIP: February 2018 Applications, Eligibility Determinations, and Enrollment Report by over 57,000. This difference does not match the 55,810 decrease in the full report for the February to March 2018 period because the 55,810 figure is based on 51 states, while the 57,000 figure is based on only 49 states.
