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



MEDICAID IN MARYLAND

Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) provide health and long-term care coverage to nearly 1.3 million low-income children, pregnant women, adults, seniors, and people with disabilities in Maryland. Medicaid is a major source of funding for safety-net hospitals and nursing homes. Federal policy proposals could fundamentally change the scope and financing of the program.





On a per enrollee basis, Medicaid spending growth is slower than private health care spending, in part due to lower provider payments.



In FY 2015, Medicaid spending in MD was \$9.6 billion.




0.92 is the Medicaid-to-Medicare physician fee ratio in MD.

56% of long-term care spending in MD is for home and community-based care.

In 2011, most Medicaid beneficiaries in MD were children and adults, but most spending was for the elderly and people with disabilities.



119,800

Medicare beneficiaries (15%) in MD rely on Medicaid for assistance with Medicare premiums and cost-sharing and services not covered by Medicare, particularly longterm care.

29%

Federal funding to states is guaranteed with no cap and fluctuates depending on program needs.

In MD the federal share (FMAP) is 50%. For every \$1 spent by the state, the Federal government matches **\$1**.

Expansion states receive an increased FMAP for the expansion population. MD received **\$2.9 billion** in federal funds for expansion adults from Jan 2014 – Sept 2015.




18% of state general fund spending in MD is for Medicaid.

48% of all federal funds received by MD is for Medicaid.

What are the implications of reduced federal financing in a Medicaid block grant or a per capita cap?

Congress may soon debate proposals to reduce federal Medicaid funding through ACA repeal and federal caps.


The March 2016 Budget Resolution would reduce federal Medicaid spending by **41%** nationally over the 2017-2026 period.



The impact of a block grant or per capita cap will depend on funding levels, but could include:



A per capita cap could lock in historical state differences or redistribute federal funds across states.
